QUALIFICATIONS:

- 1. Valid New Jersey Registered Professional Nurse License or endorsement
- 2. Demonstrated expertise in school health nursing practice and emergency procedures
- 3. Knowledge of child/adolescent growth and development, community and family dynamics, current health issues, and wellness education
- 4. Knowledge of community health and social services resources and ability to communicate effectively with nonschool health professionals and social service Agencies
- 5. Required criminal history background check and proof of U.S. citizenship or legal resident alien status

REPORTS TO: Principal or designee

JOB GOAL: To promote health and safety in the school environment

and provide health services to students, faculty and staff; to

assist with the teaching of sound health practices.

PERFORMANCE RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Works in cooperation with the certified School Nurse, school physician, other non-certified nurses, members of the staff, parents and community health professionals to ensure a healthy school climate and to minimize absence due to illness.
- 2. Conducts health services and screening programs as required by law and/or board policies under the guidance of the School Nurse.
- 3. Provides emergency care in case of sudden illness and administers first-aid in case of injury to students or staff according to established policies and procedures.
- 4. Maintains up-to-date health records on all students, maintains separate records of immunizations for the purpose of immunization record auditor and ensures their confidentiality.
- 5. Helps prevent and control communicable disease ,exclusion and re-admission of students and staff in keeping with state and local health regulations and school policies.
- 6. Notifies principal, Certified School Nurse or his/her designee to arrange for immediate examination of any pupil who appears to be under the influence of alcohol or other drugs.
- 7. Confers with and advises students, parents, and staff members on matters pertaining to the health and safety of students.

- 8. Promotes healthy/safe school environment by assisting the administration and staff to maintain safe and sanitary conditions throughout the school. Reports problems promptly to the principal and Certified School Nurse.
- 9. Administers prescribed medication to students in accordance with law and board policy. Provides training and supervision of the emergency administration of epinephrine for designated school staff.
- 10. Collaborates with community and other nonschool health agencies to meet the health needs of children and families.
- 11. Provides special health care and related services to meet the needs of students with disabilities.
- 12. Maintains professional competence through in-service education and participation in other professional development activities. Receives training in the treatment of asthma and maintains a valid current Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation for Healthcare Providers certificate as required by law and administrative code.
