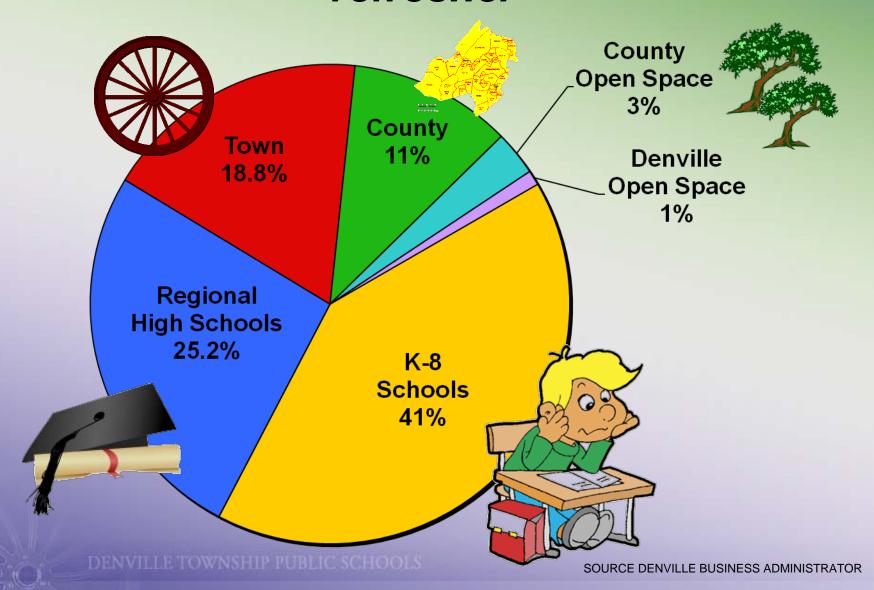

Where do Our Property Taxes Go? - refresher



Step 1 - Review Required Spending

- + Contracted Salaries, (Negotiated, then fixed for 3 years)
- + Contracted Health Benefits (Negotiated, then the benefits are fixed for 3 years, however the costs are not.)
- + Mandated Special Education Spending
- + Mandated Professional Services: Lawyer, Auditor, Architect
- + Essential Building Maintenance: Custodial supplies & repairs
- + Transportation: Required maintenance, fuel, state mandates
- + Mandated Insurances
- + Fixed Equipment Costs (financing on computers, trailers, buses)
- + State Mandated Testing Services, Mandated Election Costs

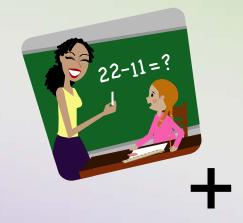
Building the 2011-2012 K-8 Denville Budget Step 3 – State and Federal Aid & Income (Revenue, other than Local Taxes)

- + State Aid: Given by Department of Education \$263,263 increase over last year's numbers
- + Federal Aid: Calculated on trend analysis and projections
- + Bank Interest: Calculated by trend analysis and projections
- + Tuition: Based on current/expected contracts and trend analysis
- + Miscellaneous Revenues

Step 4 Cont.: Calculation of Your K-8 Tax Levy

Budget Cap:

Legally, local tax increase cannot exceed 2% per year on General Fund Taxes



If it goes over, we need to request waivers / cut expenses / 2nd question

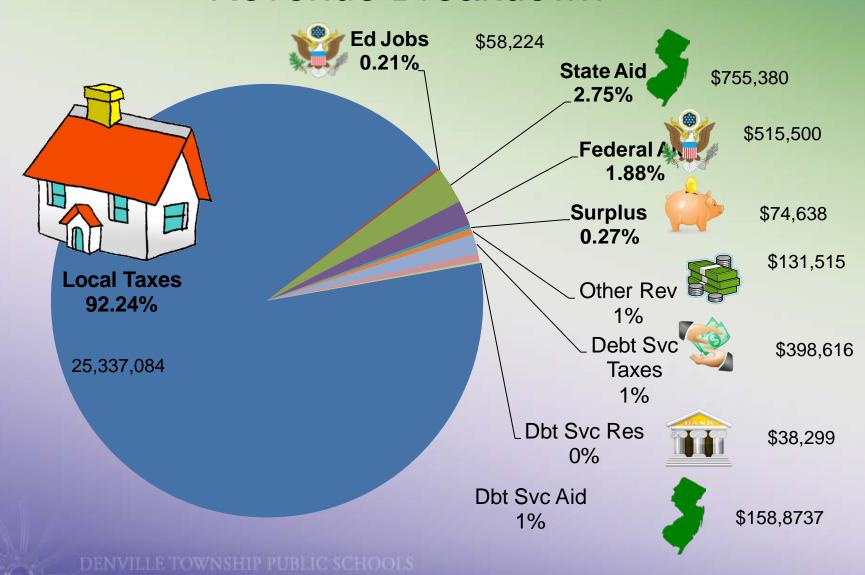

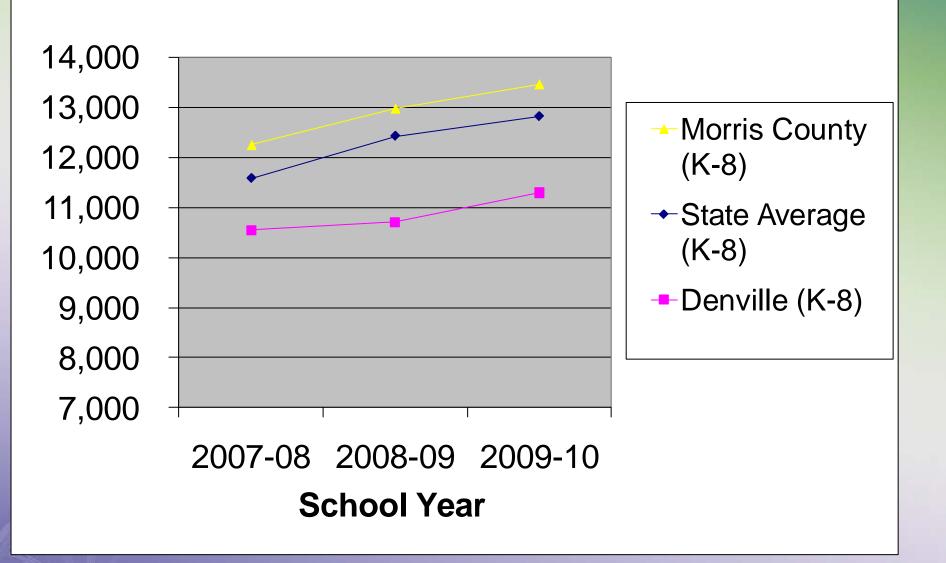

For 2011-12, costs break down as follows:

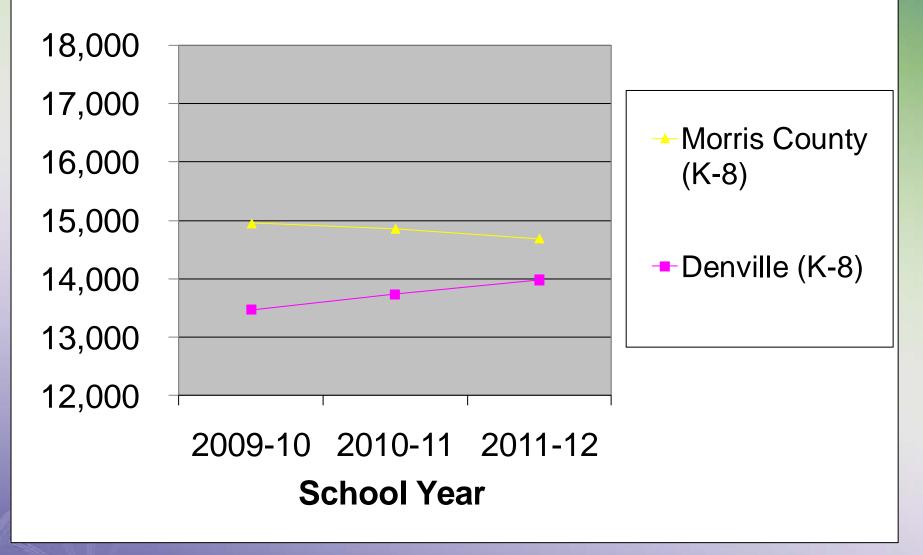

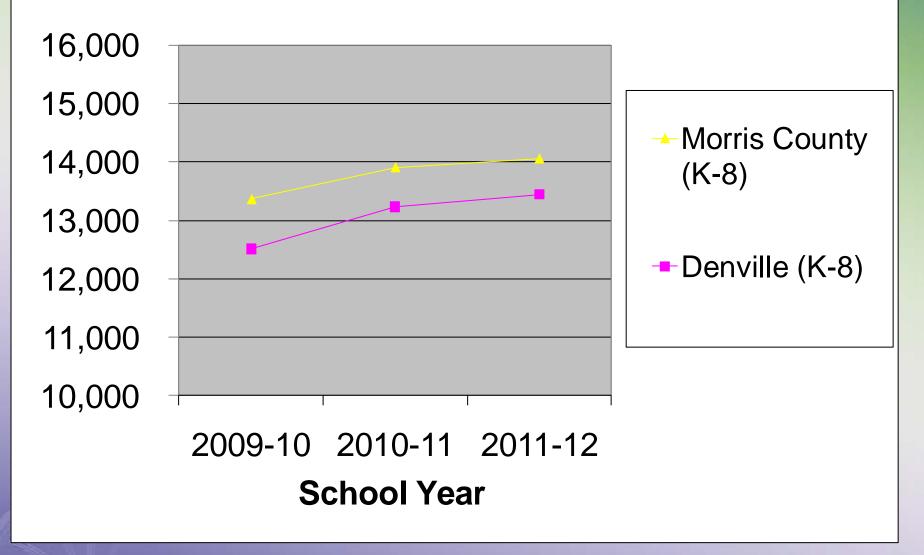

Highlights of 2011-2012 K-8 Budget

- Efficient use of monies / Changes in Curriculum to meet new state requirements AND District goals
- Plans for current Space Issues at Valleyview AND future budget constraints
- Continues Repairs to infrastructure
- Plan in place to take on Riverview Roof Repair
- Aggressive stance for Contract Negotiations

What the budget doesn't have

Plan in place to take on some repairs, as we have in past

Problem is, not as many repairs. Not tackling ALL issues brought up in Architect Survey of major repairs (handout)

An investment in our future...

- In 2010 the Morris Knolls High School Valedictorian was a Denville Township student
- In 2010, of the 16 Edward J. Bloustein Distinguished Scholars, 10 were Denville Township students
- In 2010, of the 77 Summa awards given out, 46 were to Denville Township students

Raising Standards & Providing Opportunities

- Curricular priorities in this budget include:
 - Rewriting and improving our grades 3-5 math curriculum & K-8 language arts program, while aligning with the Common Core Standards
 - Rewriting the K-8 Social Studies and World Language programs to align to the New Jersey Curriculum Core Content Standards.
 - We will be providing the materials and training to support student and teacher growth and learning.
 - The district will continue to fund professional development with workshops, conferences, resource materials and coaching to improve instructional practices, content, knowledge and student achievement.
 - Middle School Cycle classes will be revised to reflect more 21 Century themes and skills such as Global Awareness, Financial Literacy, Economic, Business and Entreprenurial Literacy.
 - Library & Writing Programs at the middle school will reflect more defined research support that is imbedded in coursework, inclusive of the science and social studies programs.
